Message from the ESA 2013 Conference Local Organizing Committee regarding conference registrations

Turin, 28-31 August 2013

In order to help meeting the challenges that the current economic crisis imposes on Universities and delegates' budgets, the Turin edition of the ESA conference 2013 will support delegates meeting the conference expenses by affording over 700 places in University accommodation (EDISU) at very competitive rates (around 20 Euro/night/person) either a few steps away or by the conference premises. The rooms do not include "hotel-like" services (i.e. night porter, breakfast, private bathrooms, daily cleaning, TV or phone in the rooms) but are located in newly built or restored buildings onsite (or very close by).

These places in single, double and triple rooms are especially meant to meet the needs of students and young researchers at early stages of their careers, as well as those of delegates coming from "Band 2 countries" and those countries especially hit by the crisis. They will be allocated on a 'first come first served' basis. Delegates will be able to choose this option in a separate section of the registration form (University Accommodation - EDISU), where they will be asked to indicate the name(s) of selected colleague(s), in case of room sharing (if no specification is given, and a place in a shared room is chosen, allocation will be on a same-sex basis).

We hope that this 'in kind contribution' towards meeting the conference costs will especially encourage a high attendance by young scholars.

Conference theme

SoNetE 2013 aims at assessing the current state of advanced social applied research, on topics as social network analysis, exchange networks, intra and inter-organizational social networks. Furthermore, we lay a special stress on how academic communities manage to deliver scientific knowledge as to meet the needs of non-academic environments (i.e. public sector, business and non-profit organizations). Put it differently, we want to discuss if there is a gap between academic communities and non-academic environments, in terms of scientific agendas. Ways of building bridges between the two parts are sought, if necessary.

SoNetE 2013 provides researchers with the possibility of presenting their research work (e.g. early stage research presentations, papers close to completion etc.) during three workshop sessions. The participants to the workshop sessions are offered the opportunity to publish their research work in a special issue of International Review of Social Research [journal](#).

We invite researchers to submit original papers on their early stage, ongoing or completed studies that are focused on either inter or intra-organizational topics, until March, 30 (for the abstracts) and until May 20, 2013 (for the papers).

Papers are invited on topics including, but not limited to, the following:

- positive and negative ties;
- voice and silence in organizations;
- organizational informal networks;
- dark networks and terrorist organizations;
- organizational decision-making strategies;
- organizational alliances, board interlocks, join-ventures and inter-firm alliances;

- power, politics and policies in and among organizations;

Registered participants will also receive a CD containing the proceedings of all collocated events, and will have a password to access any virtual session of these events, so they can comment the papers presented at any of them.

Acta Universitatis Sapientiae – Social Analysis

Call for Papers

The Editorial Board of the *Acta Universitatis Sapientiae – Social Analysis* invites manuscript submissions for the sixth issue of the journal to be published in December 2013.

Social Analysis publishes original studies focused on the analysis of various social phenomena and processes taking place in East-Central Europe. The journal seeks to provide a stance for comparative perspectives and multiple methodologies in the approaching of these themes.

The journal welcomes theoretical discussions, empirical studies, research notes and book reviews which investigate issues of social change and development, cultural reconfiguration and associated discourses in the context of East-Central Europe and its regions.

A special section of our forthcoming issue is dedicated to anthropological approaches. The East-Central European region is usually approached through studies which analyze the nature of the communist past in terms of mentality, attitudes and behaviours, respectively the ways in which these patterns of the past continue to survive after the regime change. During the last two decades this part of the world has witnessed a series of changes like the process of transition and Europeanisation, both associated with various types of crisis, deceptions and success. However, besides and beyond all these macro-level phenomena and processes, the region has developed 'all by itself' a way of life conduct in terms of surviving and transitioning strategies. Such micro-level processes, which are frequently independent from the macro-level or are even antagonistic, provide conditions and frameworks for the everyday life of the citizens. As a consequence, we seek articles which provide in-depth analysis into the everyday life of East-Central European citizens through anthropological approaches centred around discourses, narratives and observations.

Besides this general topic, we particularly encourage those articles which are concerned with the problem of space and space-appropriation on various levels, from urban and rural communities to households. On the level of the everyday life the ways in which space is organized and transformed through symbolic contents and practices (e.g. spaces for memento, but also new spaces like shopping malls, etc.) is a very salient phenomenon throughout the region. Citizens are frequently facing two kinds of constraints (frequently as the results of their accentuated involvement in transnational flows, like migration): that of re-assuring the role of the past and tradition by accentuating specific spaces and landscapes (e.g. parks of memorials, rural tourism, etc.) in parallel with seeking new ways for self- and community expression in the form of space rehabilitation, new spaces of consumerism (e.g. shopping malls), but also in the form of small scale, household-level redesigning and redecorating. Studies dealing with various anthropological approaches of space (e.g. the anthropology of commemoration, space appropriation, consumption, narratives and history of space, etc.) are thus particularly welcomed.

Acta Universitatis Sapientiae, Social Analysis is a peer-reviewed journal. All submitted manuscripts are reviewed by two anonymous referees.

For 2013, research applications on "Transformation of Migration and Societies" are especially welcome.

Migration is not only an integral part of broader social transformations; it is also a process with its own internal dynamics and changing patterns: In addition to the long term or permanent displacement of domicile, shorter forms of spatial and social mobility are increasingly subject to academic research and animate the public discussion.
