Institutional ethnography is an alternative sociology founded by Dorothy E. Smith that examines social relations and social institutions from the standpoint of the experiences of particular, active subjects. It is distinct from other sociological modes of investigation in that it is not under the direction or conceptual control of any sociological theory; rather, inquiry begins in and remains in the social world in which we live. The aims of institutional ethnography investigations are threefold. The first is to discover how it is that day in and day out we put together our social world, including how our local everyday activities are linked to and coordinated by social relations that are not entirely visible from any one location. The second aim is to develop new ways of discovering ruling relations that are consistent with the materialist social ontology of institutional ethnography. The third aim is to build knowledge of institutional processes in general. This work involves an examination of studies done in varied institutional settings and drawing out those relations and social processes that are commonly found across institutions. Throughout institutional ethnography investigations, however, the focus is on the material world: what people are doing, with whom they are doing it, and the conditions under which their activities are carried out. Institutional ethnography investigations are not limited to any specific substantive area of research or professional practice.

# Living together 'in' diversity. National societies in the multicultural age Central European University, Budapest, 21-22 May 2012

#### INTRODUCTION

Contemporary European societies have been recently characterized as having entered the age of 'super-diversity'. Migratory flows in particular have contributed to this transformation, due to the heterogeneous ethno-cultural, and religious background of present migrants, as well as their social status, age, and mobility patterns. Among the effects this transformation has brought about is the increased challenge posed to the constitutive principle of the nation-state, i.e., the assumption that identity (nation) and politics (state) can and should be mutually constituent and spatially congruent. Thus, unsurprisingly, many states have started perceiving diversity as a 'problem', potentially threatening national unity, while anti-immigration and xenophobic attitudes have experienced a rapid surge.

Existing scholarship has offered insightful critical analyses of this 'backlash against diversity', documenting the rise of repressive state measures designed to limit access of new migrants to the national territory and citizenship. Other scholars have instead moved away from the idea of the nation-state, proposing either post-national solutions, which decouple the cultural (nation) from the political (state), or transnational paradigms, which implicitly discard the focus on the nation-state as not only obsolete but also politically questionable. Yet, despite important insights from this scholarship, social and political life continues to remain largely structured by discourses, resources and institutions articulated at the national scale.

# AIM

It is therefore the aim of the proposed conference to explore how 'living together in diversity' is imagined, narrated, organized, justified, and practiced within contemporary national societies. With the stress on 'in' rather than 'with' diversity we want to move away from reifying the dominant 'majority' society perspective, which assumes diversity as something 'carried' solely by immigrants and something that the 'native' society has to cope with. Some of the questions that we are interested in are:

- What makes multicultural societies circumscribed by state borders cohere together?
- What are the ways in which the nation becomes re-signified to accommodate the ethno-cultural diversity of its populace?
- How do migrants position themselves in national narratives and political structures?
- What alternative modes and models of belonging are at work within present national societies?
- In which ways does the national continue to feature as a site of attachment?
- Is it necessary to have some form of common identification at the national scale to have functioning states in the first place?

Although we acknowledge that these questions are inescapably normative in character, we particularly welcome empirically-informed work. The privileged level of analysis we are interested in is the national

scale, but papers focusing on sub-national and supra-national scales can also be welcomed inasmuch as they can offer insights regarding how living together in diversity works at the national scale. Regionally, the conference will focus on Europe, but contributions discussing other geographical contexts are also welcomed.

#### **DEADLINES**

All potential participants are invited to submit an abstract (250-300 words) to Tatiana Matejskova (MatejskovaT@ceu.hu) by December 31st, 2011. By January 31st, 2012 participants will be informed about the acceptance of their papers. Confirmation of participation and payment of the conference fee will be due on February 28th, 2012. The conference fee of 60 Euros will cover refreshments, lunches and conference materials.

## **EXPECTED OUTCOMES**

One of the most immediate outcomes of the conference is the publication of a selection of papers in form of both an edited book with a major publishing company and a special issue to be submitted to a leading cross-disciplinary international journal. On the longer term, the conference also aims to consolidate the collaboration among the participants in form of a cross-disciplinary research network, which might lead to collective research projects to be funded by the EU and other external bodies.

# RELIGION AND POWER RELATIONS IN CENTRAL AND EASTERN EUROPE

Iaşi, Romania, April 19-21, 2012

Religious changes in Central and Eastern Europe (CEE) have been studied extensively during the past twenty years from different points of view, such as: the revitalization of religion, new social and political roles of religion, the position of different religions in society, (re)secularization as a part of modernization, and the Europeanization process of former communist societies, religions and values, etc. However, there is a challenge to rethink religious changes in connection with the concept of power, which has been increasingly employed as an explorative concept in the social sciences. The role of religion in individual life or, more importantly, the meaning and use of religion by individuals is difficult to understand without relation to the concept of power. Religion can also inspire social processes, but the modern social arena is crowded with different agents, different positions, interests and strategies of acting, and the different networks inside which they operate. Some fundamental questions are: "What are the positions of different religious communities within modern social arenas?", "How do various social and political powers (mis)use religions?", and "How do religions mis(use) their power?".

The Conference organizers invite you to address such questions and propose your paper in line with the Conference title, particularly in relation to **the following subthemes**:

- Religion and empowerment
- Religion and power: institutional vs. individual perspectives
- Power in relation to majority and minority religions
- Religion, power, and gender
- Religion, power and well-being
- Democratization, the restructuring of power, and religiosity in CEE
- Religion and secular power
- Religious practice among different confessional traditions
- State control and religions in CEE

# SOCIETY, CRISIS AND SOCIAL RECONFIGURATIONS

#### **1ST CALL FOR PAPERS**

Within the contemporary world, especially on the last decades, social chance processes with unprecedented extents are marching on. Portuguese society is not an exception to that pattern, marked by intensity, volatility and, in many cases, with difficult enlightenment. Notwithstanding enduring and immobility should not be neglected.

The so called financial crises, highly covered and with a large impact worldwide but also at a national, regional and local, exposes and dazzles the existence of deep reconfiguration processes at the core of primordial social institutions; education, work, family, justice, economy and science. But this crisis is, after all, a total social phenomenon, necessary to shed light on through an acute sociological reflection, aiming towards surpassing clues in a emancipator way. Borrowing from Michael Burawoy, the President of the International Sociological Association and first key speaker of the VII Portuguese Sociological Congress, this congress's main appeal should be the recognition of the sociological science as a critic yet constructive interpellation towards society.

The Scientific community is, nowadays, facing a high stake risk: to let its analytical autonomy walk lamely hence subscribing aprioristic and conventional assumptions from the common sense or embrace its design of understanding and explaining the complex social reality, not as a supportive narrative but manly as critical and constructive one.

For more than 25 years, Portuguese sociologists have been present at the Portuguese Sociological Association Congresses, contributing for the gathering of irrefutable scientific quality, long side with high participation levels and always undertaking its ethical and professional responsibilities facing the collective.

The VII Portuguese Sociological Congress, taking place at Oporto University during the 20 and 23 of June of 2012, enrolls in the described scientific and civil tradition giving the opportunity to demonstrate the communities' vitality and the exercise of sociological reflection regarding deep societal changes.

Accordingly, this will be the first congress that focuses on the organizational dynamic of the Association's Thematic Groups (similar to Research Committees). Therefore the multiple working sessions will be organized, when possible, by the Thematic Groups, created between 2008 and 2011 but also contemplating other thematic areas hallowed in previous congresses. Depending on the presentation of a proposal by the associates, other working groups can be created.

Due to economic, political, social and technological transformations the communicative system of the "globalized" society is of big importance in framing concepts and ideas; the media are the forum of social representations, discourses and narrations and an important host of the contemporary ideas and myths (including ideas of democracy and justice —or injustice), expressing the characteristics of the contemporary culture.

Attention will be given to issues such as the relationship between culture (consumer culture) and market (which transforms art into business and often usurps creative freedom), the role of cultural industries and of new media as well as the "construction" of the contemporary knowledge (in a sense "technically diverted").
